New Business

Discussion with Glenn Chalder regarding the survey results and the POCD

Glenn Chalder went over the survey results (see enclosure). 536 total participants. A conversation was held regarding the results and the thoughts of those that attended the meeting. Glenn Chalder stated that he has been looking at past POCD's and meeting with department heads to build strategies to move forward with development of the new POCD.

A suggestion was given to implement mid-term updates of the POCD. Also suggested was to shorten the survey to get more responses. Glenn Chalder stated that a pre-survey is needed to know which questions to ask in future surveys.

Education of the public is key in moving forward on the POCD and ensuring that the public knows the vision of the POCD.

A big question is how can the POCD be more effective. A comment was made to present the items of importance that include the realities of the decisions and that this should include a benefit analysis. Glenn Chalder stated that setting the stage at a strategic level, in the future the specifics of the project will come out, and that the POCD needs to be more strategic.

Glenn Chalder stated he needs guidance and recommendations on specific policies or action steps to move forward on and that the POCD needs to resonate with the community. Glenn Chalder suggested distilling the information down to the key elements and within some of the policy areas to get priorities for the POCD. He stated that it should be 5-10 action items. Cynthia Ross-Zweig stated to keep in mind that the POCD is used when applying for grants. A comment was made to look at what kind of business the Town of New Fairfield wants to attract. Glenn Chalder stated that businesses are not the only way to look at economic development. He stated that housing can also be a part of economic development. Education on this would be needed for the community.

A conversation was held regarding a community center and the pros and cons of building one in town. The community center could be utilized even when schools are in session by those in the community.

A conversation was held on the number of non-conforming lots in town and how the POCD can address these scenarios. This topic does not fall directly under the Planning Commission but the Planning Commission can make a recommendation to the Zoning Commission on these types of issues. The plan is to work with other commissions not against other commissions.

There is a second listening session on the 27th of November which will talk about the infrastructure and get ideas on other commissions on how to make the POCD more effective.

Glenn Chalder will put together a summary of what was learned from this survey and will share it with the board and the community.

Glenn Chalder requested a working session style meeting for some time in December. This idea will be addressed at the November 27, 2023 Planning Commission Regular Meeting.

Adjournment

Ernie Lehman made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 8:43 pm. Gary Reetz seconded the motion. (4-0-0) All in favor

If something were to happen in my family and we had to only rely on one income, we could not afford the house we live in and I don't know

where we'd have to move. When I look at listings, anything that I could possibly afford on just half our income is less than 1000 square feet in desperate need of repairs. And then those are usually bought by flippers who turn around and make it unaffordable.






















