Call To Order

First Selectman Melissa Lindsey called the meeting to order for the BOS at 7:30pm BOF Chairman Thora Perkins called the meeting to order for the BOF at 7:30pm PBC Chairman Don Kellogg called the meeting to order for the PBC at 7:30 pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

Public Comment

Jennifer Pappas spoke of concerns of capital projects and how they affect the town taxes. She specifically spoke in opposition of the Margerie Trail project and Affordable Housing. She further noted that there is no need to demolish the playground at this time.

Lore White spoke of accountability for money spent on capital projects in the past. She specifically spoke of the Beach House project and how ARPA funds were spent. She gave some suggestions for uses of the old Consolidated School building.

Cynthia Ross-Zweig spoke of the requirement of the PBC to inspect town buildings on a regular basis and the need for routine maintenance on town buildings. She asked for a full audit of all expenditures of current capital projects.

Fire Chief Bruce Taylor spoke of the dangerous condition of the old Consolidated School and spoke in support of the demolition of the building.

Fire Marshal Chris Alward gave specific examples of the dangers of the condition of Consolidated School and noted that it is unsafe for use.

Discussion of request made by the PBC regarding funding for the demolition of the old Consolidated School building.

There was a discussion of the original plan in 2019 to demolish the original Consolidated School. There was a brief discussion of the repairing of the problems with the propane at the high school.

PBC Chairman Don Kellogg spoke of the demolition phase of the old Consolidated School and confirmed that there is insufficient funding in the current MHHS/CELA project budget to abate and demolish the existing building. Factors that contributed to this shortfall include the delay associated with the bus lot, building costs escalations and a significant increase in the abatement costs. He noted that there is an unencumbered contingency in the high school project of approximately \$1,500,000 which is more than adequate to cover the requested transfer to the demolition and still maintain a significant contingency in the high school budget. With the recommended transfer of funds, the remaining unencumbered contingency for the High School will be approximately \$900,000 including all pending expenditures. It was noted that the bus lot and demolition of Consolidated School are tied together in Phase 2. This is strictly a transfer from one project to another and no additional taxpayers funds are need for this project.

Consolidated School Demolition and Abatement Funding Transfer Memorandum. 8-12-24

The Consolidated Elementary School demolition phase has been bid, confirming that there is insufficient funding remaining in the current MHHS/CELA project budget to abate and demolish the existing Consolidated Elementary School. Multiple factors contributed to the shortfall including the delay associated with the bus lot, building costs escalations and a significant increase in the abatement costs.

The High School Project is substantially complete and there is unencumbered contingency of approximately \$1,500,000 which is more than adequate to allow the requested funding transfer to the MHHS/CELA project while maintaining a significant High School contingency.

Attached is the final Phase 2 pricing sheet showing the total Phase 2 cost of \$2,973,416. The following is the total available funding for both the HS and CELA projects along with the recommended transfer to complete the demolition and abatement phase.
