Historic Properties Commission Chairman Gerry Bielizna spoke of the Creamery and noted that it was added to the State Register of Historic Places by Connecticut Historic Council on October 1, 2014. Mr. Bielizna noted that the Creamery is now eligible for the Federal Historic Preservation Enhancement Grant and several supplemental grants. The federal grant is up to \$10,000 and does not require a matching grant. A feasibility study will tell what can be done with this building. It was noted that if the town applies in January, they should know by February. Resident Tom Quigley noted that this property is located in a flood zone.

Selectman Mike Gill asked to have documentation of these grant. First Selectman Susan Chapman suggested having Architect Steve Lazarus to look at the building and give his opinion as to whether or not it is financially feasible to keep the Creamery.
